Rowles Fine Art from Ludlow return with a collection of fine late 19th and 20th century paintings, watercolours and sculpture, while church Street Antiques from Altrincham offer a wide range of chic designer interior pieces including sofas and mirrors. The fair also includes several silver and jewellery specialists; Plaza, Thomas Glower from Shrewsbury, Stephen Kalms Antiques from London, Billy Rae from Scotland and Shapiro & Co from London.

Other specialists include Jo Bennett Fine Paintings featuring northern artists such as Geoffrey Key; Solo Antiques with Art Nouveau and Art Deco glass and sculpture, and Garret & Hurst with 19th and early 20th century French sculpture. Roger de Ville returns as usual with rare early English pottery.
